At Job Corps, you can train in a variety of high-growth Homeland Security career areas. All training programs are hands-on, and you will train in real work environments. Students also have access to training and academic classes with local community colleges and/or technical institutions through partnerships with the Job Corps Centers.

Earn industry-recognized credentials from organizations such as the International Foundation for Protection Officers (IFPO) and state-issued credentials/licenses.



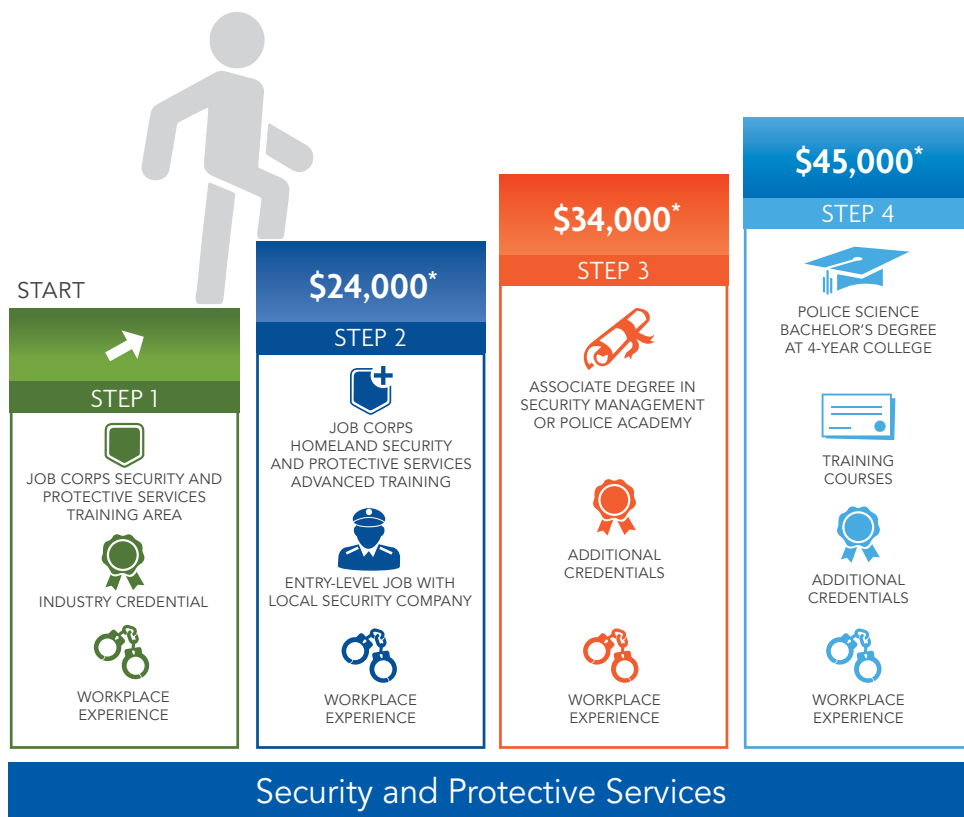
The average starting salary for most security guards is \$26,000 a year.*
